Why be a Foster Grandparent?

- To provide nurturing, friendship, and person-to-person relationship to children with special or exceptional needs.
- To help children develop to their potential.
- To continue to serve the community and make a difference.

Eligibility

- Must be 60 years of age or older
Effective 1/23/08, must have a total annual income at or below the following eligibility levels:
 - a. Individual: \$16,825
 - b. Family of 2: \$22,630
 - c. Family of 3: \$28,435
 - d. Family of 4: \$34,240

For family units with more than four members add \$5,805 for each additional member.

- Be physically and mentally healthy
- Not in the regular work force
- Willing to accept supervision
- Able to work a minimum of 15 hours a week

- Non-taxable stipend of \$2.65 per hour
- One nutritious meal per work day
- Transportation allowance
- Pre-entrance and annual physical exams
- Accident and liability insurance
- Vacation and sick leaves
- State holidays
- Training
- Field trips
