She/he is friendly, warm, understanding and affectionate.

She/he has patience and can maintain self-control in difficult or startling situations.

She/he is healthy and physically strong enough to be regularly on the job and keep up with the children all day.

She/he likes to provide many interesting and fun things for the children to do.

She/he is willing to share her living quarters and some of her personal possessions with others.

She/he organizes herself well enough to meet the children's needs, her family's needs, her own needs, and keeps up with child care home business, too.

She/he accepts and cooperates with those who have the legal responsibility to protect children in care.

The children in care change and develop some every day. How and what they learn depends largely on the example set for them by the family child care operator, on the operator's relationship to them and on what is provided for them.
