Older Individuals Who Are Blind (OIB) Program

Ho`opono's Older Individuals Who Are Blind Program (OIB) is a statewide program which assists elderly blind and visually impaired adults 55 years or older to adjust to their vision loss by developing new skills. Rehabilitation Teachers meet with individuals in their homes to assess the need for and provide instruction in the following:

- * Personal Care
- * Home Management
- * Food Management
- * Communication
- * Mobility
- * Socialization Skills



Low Vision Clinic

Upon referral from your eye doctor, clinic services are available to blind and visually impaired children and adults and provide:

- * Free eye examinations and annual re-examinations
- * Prescriptions for optical aids.
- * Fittings of optical aids and other devices to improve the visual acuity of persons with low vision or who are diagnosed as legally blind.
- * Hands on demonstrations and training in the use of low vision aids and appliances.
- * Counseling to individuals and families
- * Referrals to community resources.

Business Enterprise Program (BEP)

Mission: To empower Hawaii's blind people to achieve social and economic self sufficiency through business opportunities.

Vending facilities are located in federal, state and county buildings. The BEP Staff evaluate applicants and provide ongoing management services to operators. They provide training in areas such as advertising & promotion, bookkeeping, inventory control, customer service, tax filing, financial management, maintenance, ordering merchandise, bill payments, selling merchandise and other tasks entailed with operating a small business. Ho`opono actively participates in decision making with the elected Hawai'i State Committee of Blind Vendors.

Vocational Rehabilitation Services
