REPORT ON ACT 134, PART VII, SECTION 118, RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2013 AND SECTION 346-51.5, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES

ACT 134, PART VII, SECTION 118, SLH 2013, requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to prepare a report on the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Temporary Assistance for Other Needy Families (TAONF) programs that includes:

- 1) The program's measures of effectiveness, projected and actual outcomes;
- 2) Work participation rates for two-parent families and all-families included in the calculation of the Federal work participation rate;
- 3) A listing of Hawaii businesses participating in TANF and TAONF funded work programs and amounts subsidized;
- 4) A listing of all contracts funded by the TANF and TAONF programs categorized by purpose that identifies program priority levels, amounts contracted, means of financing, an explanation of the benefits derived from each contract, and identification of all laws that require state to provide the service; and
- 5) Utilization levels of each contract funded by the TANF and TAONF programs and populations served.

Section 346-51.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statute, requires the Department of Human Services to submit:

- 1) A plan for expenditure of TANF funds to include, a) details how the funds received under TANF shall be expended; and b) descriptions of the desired outcomes from the expenditure of the funds; and
- 2) A report about a) the continuing strategic planning process, with the assistance of the Financial Assistance Advisory Council (FAAC), to involve the community in planning for the future use of TANF funds and setting annual goals and outcomes for existing and new programs receiving TANF; b) on the effectiveness and level of success in reaching the desired outcomes from the previous two fiscal years using TANF funds; and c) on any funds received and expended supplemental to the TANF block grant, the purposes for which the funds were expended; and outcomes achieved.

ACT 134, PART VII, SECTION 118 SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII (SLH) 2013

1) TANF Measures of Effectiveness - Projected and Actual Outcomes

The outcomes for the TANF Program, as reflected in the State Budget, are as follows:

a) Measure of Effectiveness:

Potentially eligible households receiving TANF assistance:

FY 2014 Planned = 43%

FY 2015 Planned = 43%

Actual = 44.4%

b) Mandatory Households Meeting All-Family Work Participation Requirements:

FY 2014 Planned = 50%

Actual = 47.8% (prior to the application of caseload reduction credit¹)

FY 2015 Planned = 50% (prior to the application of any caseload reduction or other credits)

Mandatory Households Meeting Two-Parent Families Work Participation Requirements:

FY 2014 Planned = 57%

Actual = 60.0% (prior to the application of caseload reduction and other credits)

FY 2015 Planned = 57% (prior to the application of any caseload reduction or other credits)

c) Percent of TANF Recipients in Work Program Exiting Due to Employment:

FY 2014 Planned = 20%

FY 2015 Planned = 22%

Actual = 21%

The percentage of TANF recipients in work programs exiting due to employment fell below our planned outcome level. Although the State's economic forecast has been positive, we believe the program policy change that increased the earned income variable percentage deduction from 36% to 55% impacts the number of TANF families that exit due to employment. The increased earned income variable percentage deduction allows families to earn higher hourly wage and continue to be eligible for assistance as they work towards self-sufficiency.

¹ Pursuant to Section 407(b)(3) of the Social Security Act (the Act), the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Administration for Children and Families (ACF), reduces a State's required participation rate for a federal fiscal year (FFY) when the number of percentage points that the average monthly number of families receiving assistance during the year immediately preceding the current fiscal year is less than the average monthly number of families that received assistance during the comparison year (FFY 1995). The statute prohibits this reduction from including any caseload declines due to requirements of Federal law or due to differences in State eligibility criteria. The reduction in the participation rate is referred to as the caseload reduction credit.

For SFY 2014, the median wage of employed TANF recipients was \$9.51/hour and worked an average of 34 hours/week. Based on estimate gross earnings of \$1,401 per month, a family of three would continue to be eligible for TANF benefits.

2) Work Participation Rates

The Federal government mandates that states meet two work participation rates as a condition of receiving and expending TANF federal block grant funding and state Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirements. The two work participation rates are: 1) a two-parent participation rate in 90% of cases where there are 2 work eligible parents who are complying with their federally mandated work activities; and 2) an all-family participation rate in 50% of all cases that have at least one work eligible individual who is complying with their federally mandated work activities.

a) All-Family Work Participation Rate:

The 50% compliance rate for the all-family rate is the federal baseline before factoring in the caseload reduction credit, the credit to the State for declining assistance caseloads. Hawaii's caseload reduction credit for FFY 2014 is estimated to be 47.8%. The adjusted all-family work participation requirement to be met is 2.2% (50% - 47.8% = 2.2%). As of December 4, 2014, 47.8% of mandatory households were meeting the work participation requirements for FFY 2014. Therefore, Hawaii is currently exceeding the required participation, 47.8% compared to 2.2%.

b) Two-Parent Work Participation Rate:

The 90% compliance rate for the two-parent rate is the federal baseline before factoring in the caseload reduction credit. The same estimated caseload reduction credit for FFY 2014 of 47.8% can be applied. The adjusted two-parent work participation requirement to be met is 42.2% (90% - 47.8% = 42.2%). As of December 4, 2014, 60.0% of mandatory two-parent households were meeting the work participation requirements for FFY 2014. Therefore, Hawaii is currently exceeding the required participation, 60.0% compared to 42.2%.

SECTION 346-51.5, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES

1) Expenditure Plan of TANF Funds

- a) Details How the Funds Received Under TANF Shall Be Expended:
 - Planned expenditures of TANF Federal funds for FY 2015 are detailed in the financial report required by Act 134, Part VII, Section 117, and is being submitted as a different report.
 - Supplemental Funding: In addition to the annual TANF Block Grant funding, Hawaii also received a portion of the TANF Contingency Fund that was available during Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2014. The amount of TANF Contingency Funding received was \$9,821,258.

The TANF Contingency Fund provides funding for States to provide benefits and services to needy families in times of economic downturns. A state may receive 1/12 of 20 percent of its annual block grant for each month that it qualifies as an "eligible state." If the state qualifies for contingency fund for the full fiscal year, such expenditures are multiplied by the State's Medicaid match rate in order to determine the amount that the state may keep. However, if the state is an eligible state for less than the full year, the match rate is reduced by the fraction of the year that the state qualified as an "eligible state." Thus, a state may receive up to 20 percent of its TANF Block Grant, if eligible for an entire year.

To qualify for contingency funds, states must spend non-Federal funded MOE State dollars at 100% of its pre-TANF Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) level and meet one of two "needy state" triggers: 1) high unemployment rates or 2) high Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) caseloads (formerly known as Food Stamps):

- An unemployment rate for a 3-month period that is at least 6.5 percent and 100 percent of the rate for the corresponding period in either of the two preceding calendar years; or
- A SNAP caseload that is 10% over the FY 1994-1995 level (adjusted for the impact of the 1995 welfare reform law's immigrant and Food Stamp provisions on the Food Stamp caseload).

In FFY 2014, Hawaii met one of the two triggers to qualify for available TANF Contingency Funds. Hawaii used the full amount of TANF Contingency Funds to address increased expenditure on assistance payments.

b) <u>Descriptions of the Desired Outcomes from the Expenditure of Funds:</u> Please refer to Attachment 3.

2) Financial Assistance Advisory Council (FAAC):

The Financial Assistance Advisory Council (FAAC) met on July 2, 2013 to update members on DHS-related bills that passed in the 2013 Legislative Session. The FAAC planned to revisit some of the Administration bills that did not pass; discuss potential bills to introduce for the 2014 Legislative Session; and to engage with other departments in supporting low-income tax credits and raising the state minimum wage.

Several policy changes were suggested such as reviewing the current foster board payment scale; reducing the monthly overpayment percentage of 10%; insurance coverage for autism; and revisiting the Standard of Need for TANF. A guest inquired about financial literacy but the Department currently does not have funds to provide the services.

The FAAC also provided program updates such as Medicaid eligibility and the Kauhale (community) On-Line Eligibility Assistance (KOLEA) system that went live on October 1, 2013. It was also reported that DHS received approval for a Limited English Proficient (LEP) Translation Project. The LEP project team will begin with the Med-QUEST Division (MQD) to translate documents for the KOLEA system. The LEP Translation Project will expand to include translation of materials of the other DHS divisions.

On December 10, 2013, the FAAC met and discussed various bills for the 2014 Legislative Session. Bills that may impact program services for the needy population were discussed in particular such as General Assistance (GA), hospital sustainability, state minimum wage, foster board payments, adult protective services, and housing programs. In addition, the FAAC discussed budgetary concerns such as voluntary foster care, TANF, financial literacy, and Individual Development Account (IDA) program.
