		Gender categories
		TRANSGENDER: A person whose gender identity (i.e., internal sense of feeling male or female) is different from the person's assigned sex at birth.
		INTERSEX: A person whose sexual or reproductive anatomy or chromosomal pattern does not seem to fit typical definitions of male or female. Intersex medical conditions are sometimes referred to as disorders of sex development.
