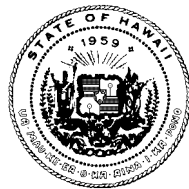

Section 346-51.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to prepare a report on the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Temporary Assistance for Other Needy Families (TAONF) programs that includes:

- 1) A plan for expenditure of TANF funds to include, a) details how the funds received under TANF shall be expended; and b) descriptions of the desired outcomes from the expenditure of the funds; and
- 2) A report about a) the continuing strategic planning process, with the assistance of the Financial Assistance Advisory Council, to involve the community in planning for the future use of TANF funds and setting annual goals and outcomes for existing and new programs receiving TANF; b) on the effectiveness and level of success in reaching the desired outcomes from the previous two fiscal years using TANF funds; and c) on any funds received and expended supplemental to the TANF block grant, the purposes for which the funds were expended; and outcomes achieved.

**II. TANF STRATEGIC PLANNING AND LEVEL OF SUCCESS**

**A. The Financial Assistance Advisory Council (FAAC)**

No meetings were conducted during fiscal year 2020.

**B. TANF Measures of Effectiveness and Level of Success in Reaching Outcomes**

The Governor's Sixth Supplementary Emergency Proclamation for COVID-19, signed on April 25, 2020, suspended section 346-261, HRS, which established the State's TANF mandatory work program. The Supplementary Proclamation provides the Director of the Department of Human Services the authority to modify the administrative rules for the purposes of assisting families in need and those who were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The suspension of section 346-261, HRS, remains in effect until the Governor lifts the suspension through a separate proclamation or terminates the Emergency Proclamation for COVID-19, whichever occurs first.

Pursuant to the Emergency Proclamation, the upfront work participation, required as a condition of initial TANF eligibility, was waived for TANF applicants. This reduced the

processing time of TANF applications and allowed eligible families to receive their benefits sooner.

Families who are determined eligible for TANF benefits are immediately referred to the First-To-Work (FTW) Program for participation as a condition of continued eligibility. Participation in the FTW Program is an opportunity for TANF recipient families to receive much needed supportive services, counseling, case management services, and resources during the crisis period. Furthermore, the FTW Program will be able to assist the TANF recipient families to transition back into the workforce during the State's recovery.

Prior to the outbreak of COVID-19 in Hawaii, the TANF and TAONF caseloads, combined, were at its lowest at 3,969 recipient families in March 2020. Since then, the caseload increased by about 78%, a total of 7,102 active cases as of December 2020, a caseload level not seen since 2015. For SFY 2020, the TAONF caseload saw the greatest impact reaching its highest in June 2020 at 1,198 recipient families, approximately a 117% increase when compared to February 2020 (pre-pandemic).

The outcomes for the TANF Program, as reflected in the State Budget, are as follows:

1. Percentage of Households Determined Eligible for TANF Assistance

FY 2020 Planned = 24%

FY 2020 Actual = 43% average per month

Pre-pandemic = 35% average per month<sup>2</sup>

Pandemic = 53% average per month

FY 2021 Planned = 35%

2. Percentage of TANF Recipients in Work Program Exiting Due to Employment

FY 2020 Planned = 12% average per month

FY 2020 Actual = 12% average per month

Pre-pandemic = 13% average per month

Pandemic = 9% average per month

FY 2021 Planned = 14%

For SFY 2020, the average wage of employed work program participants was \$12.82/hour. Based on 30 employment hours per week, the estimated gross earnings of \$1,538 per month would allow a family of three to be eligible for TANF benefits.

3. Percentage of TANF Recipients Who Obtained Employment

FY 2020 Actual = 25% of TANF recipient families (average per month)

Pre-pandemic = 26% average per month

Pandemic = 19% average per month

FY 2021 Planned = 15% (average per month)

4. Percentage of TANF Households Exited Due to Earnings

FY 2020 Actual = Of the total families who exited TANF each month, 13% of the families exited due to earned income (average per month)

Pre-pandemic = 14% (average per month)

Pandemic = 12% (average per month)

FY 2021 Planned = 14%

5. Supporting Employment Empowerment (SEE) Hawaii Work Program

DHS implemented the SEE Program in 2006 to provide on-the-job training and employment opportunities with private sector employers for First-To-Work (FTW) Program participants that may have little or no work experience or basic work skills. Participants employed through the SEE Program may work a minimum of 24 hours per week, for up to six (6) months.

Participating employers set and pay SEE employees' (FTW participants) wages and benefits. The State reimburses the employers 100% of the state's hourly minimum wage. For each additional \$1.00 per hour paid to the SEE employee, the State reimburses the employer \$0.50. The maximum hourly rate paid to the employee that may be subsidized is \$14.00, and the employee may work no more than 40 hours/week. Employers also are reimbursed 14% of the subsidized wages to cover the cost of training and other employment-related costs and overhead expenses. Additionally, the State provides SEE employees supportive service payments such as transportation and child care assistance.

a) *Participants Employed Through the SEE Program:*

SFY 2019 = 45 (unduplicated) FTW participants

SFY 2020 = 58 (unduplicated) FTW participants

b) *Average Work Hours and Wage:*

SFY 2019 = Average of 27 hours/week for an average wage of \$11.15/hour

SFY 2020 = Average of 33 hours/week for an average wage of  
\$10.75/hour

c) *Transitioned from Subsidized to Unsubsidized Employment:*

SFY 2019 = 43% transitioned from SEE to unsubsidized employment

SFY 2020 = 50% transitioned from SEE to unsubsidized employment

d) *Businesses Participated with the SEE Program:*

SFY 2019 = 44 SEE employers

SFY 2020 = 267 SEE employers<sup>3</sup>

6. Work Participation Rates

The Federal government mandates that states meet two work participation rates as a condition of receiving and expending TANF Federal Block Grant and State Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirements.

- a) *All-Family Participation Rate of 50%:* Of all TANF recipient cases that have at least one work eligible individual who is complying with their federally mandated work activities.

The 50% compliance rate for the All-Family Rate is the federal baseline before factoring in the caseload reduction credit, the credit to the State for declining assistance caseloads. Hawaii's Caseload Reduction Credit for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2020 is estimated to be 79.4%. The adjusted All-Family work participation requirement to be met is zero percent (50% - 79.4% = 0%).<sup>4</sup>

As of December 2020, 18.2% of mandatory households were meeting the work participation requirements for FFY 2020. Therefore, Hawaii is currently exceeding the required participation, 18.2% compared to zero percent.

*Mandatory Households Meeting All-Family Work Participation Requirements*

FFY 2020 Planned = 50%

Actual = 18.18% (prior to the application of the Caseload Reduction Credit)

Pre-pandemic = 26.56%

Pandemic = 12.19%

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<sup>3</sup> The contract to administer the SEE Program was re-procured and awarded in 2019 for services beginning SFY 2020. The scope of services was expanded to include job placement services for unsubsidized employment in addition to subsidized employment.

<sup>4</sup> Pursuant to Section 407(b)(3) of the Social Security Act (the Act), the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Administration for Children and Families (ACF), reduces a state's required participation rate for a Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) when the number of percentage points that the average monthly number of families receiving assistance during the year immediately preceding the current fiscal year is less than the average monthly number of families that received assistance during the comparison year (FFY 1995). The statute prohibits this reduction from including any caseload declines due to requirements of Federal law or due to differences in state eligibility criteria. The reduction in the participation rate is referred to as the Caseload Reduction Credit.

FFY 2021 Planned = 15% (prior to the application of the Caseload Reduction Credit)

- b) *Two-Parent Participation Rate of 90%:* Of all TANF recipient cases that have two work eligible parents who are complying with their federally mandated work activities.

The 90% compliance rate for the Two-Parent Rate is the federal baseline before factoring in the Caseload Reduction Credit. The same estimated Caseload Reduction Credit for FFY 2020 of 79.4% can be applied. The adjusted Two-Parent Participation Rate to be met is 10.6% (90% - 79.4% = 10.6%).

As of December 2020, 26.4% of mandatory two-parent households were meeting the work participation requirements for FFY 2019. Therefore, Hawaii is currently exceeding the required participation, 26.4% compared to 10.6%.

*Mandatory Households Meeting Two-Parent Families Work Participation Requirements*

FFY 2020 Planned = 45%

FFY 2020 Actual = 26.4% (prior to the application of the caseload reduction credit)

Pre-pandemic = 42.30%

Pandemic = 15.10%

FY 2021 Planned = 20% (prior to the application of the caseload reduction credit)

7. *Supplemental Funding*

In addition to the annual TANF Block Grant, states may be eligible to receive a portion of the TANF Contingency Fund. The TANF Contingency Fund provides funding for states to provide benefits and services to needy families in times of economic downturns. A state may receive 1/12 of 20 percent of its annual block grant for each month that it qualifies as an “eligible state”. If the state qualifies for contingency fund for the full fiscal year, such expenditures are multiplied by the state’s Medicaid match rate to determine the amount that the state may keep. However, if the state is eligible for less than the full year, the match rate is reduced by the fraction of the year that the state qualified as an “eligible state”. Thus, a state may receive up to 20 percent of its TANF Block Grant, if eligible for an entire year.

To qualify for and expend TANF contingency funds, states must spend Maintenance of Effort (MOE) State dollars that equal 100% of the State’s share of the FFY 1994 expenditures under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) and Job

Opportunities and Basic Skills (JOBS) programs (i.e. pre-TANF), and meet one of two “needy state” triggers:

1. *High Unemployment Rate*: An unemployment rate for a 3-month period that is at least 6.5 percent and 100 percent of the rate for the corresponding period in either of the two preceding calendar years; or
2. *High Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Caseloads*: A SNAP (formerly known as Food Stamps) caseload that is 10 percent over the FY 1994-1995 level (adjusted for the impact of the 1995 welfare reform law’s immigrant and Food Stamp provisions on the Food Stamp caseload).

Due to the MOE State expenditure requirement, the department did not apply for the FFY 2020 TANF Contingency Funds.

NOTES:

- (1) The only time that DHS has reliable figures for the actual amount in the TANF Reserve is at the end of December following the close of the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY).
- (2) Reserve amount reflected is TANF Block Grant funding that was unspent due to declining caseloads and TANF Contingency Funds received in previous fiscal years. The reserve is established to ensure benefits and supportive services for recipients families and operational costs can be maintained for about twelve months should there be a federal government shutdown or funds are not appropriated by the U.S. Congress.
- (3) For SFY 2021, the balance of \$12.6 million in State MOE reflects budget considerations made in response to the economic downturn as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. For SFY 2022, the State MOE beginning balance reflects the \$12 million reduction.
