Training for judges because they were holding the juvenile longer than the federal guidelines. Additional training on Friday to bring them up to date on the waived juveniles</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 violation this FY:2021-2022, 1 at DH and 1 at Kapolei Police Station. <p>The 1 at DH is for the same reason and fell into this fiscal year. The violation at Kapolei is because the juvenile was taken to the hospital and then brought back to the cell, therefore the clock is still running, and it violated the 6 hours</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Compliance Monitoring Report</u> Working on a new State Compliance Monitor Manual. After an audit, many States did not have the statutory and regulatory language in their manual. We were given until June 13, 2022 to complete the manual before we start on complete the report.

Pedro Honolulu County</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Major Pedro reported HPD has a scheduled meeting with Family Court regarding the Alder facility and start up a new diversion program. He also wants to bring up the expungement of juvenile records with the Courts • The Alder facility is the new Diversion Center, and will have Emergency Shelter, Wrap Around" services as well as an entrepreneurial program. 			

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	<p>(10:17)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lt. T. Gomez reported that Maui JCPD is operating at 50% and will be losing another two officers within the next two months. Also lost their Civilian Juvenile Counselor Supervisor and one other Juvenile Counselor, they are working with one counselor as the other counselor is out on sick leave. • New administration is making changes. The SROs were involved in 626 incidents, 139 juveniles arrested, and 12 adults arrested. • He had heard that the administration is planning to move the SROs back to Patrol Division due to the lack of manpower in patrol. Not getting the police recruits they need. • Because of the lack of manpower, they had to cancel their KALO Program and only has the POI Program. They have had 281 kids come through their program. They may have to close the POI Program also, depending on the new administration's plans for the Maui Police Department. <p>(10:19) Hawai'i County</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lt. Pauole of the Hawai'i County Police Department also is having a shortage in their Patrol Division, but his section is able to keep their SROs. • The Juvenile Aid Section is down two detectives, but with the promotions soon he expects those vacancies to be filled. 			

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Their Section not only investigates juvenile cases but is involved in Felony Sex Abuse Domestic Violence Cases and Sex Assaults against juvenile cases. <p>(10:20) B. Thompson Kaua'i County</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In April, since school is back in session, they had 52 arrests of juveniles. Mostly Runaways and Truancy. • Their 3 SRO's are back in the schools. • The Kauai Police Department are looking into the K-Pal/SRO positions, with are the PO-9 or corporal positions to assist the SROs. No one has applied for these positions, which is working with Community Relations Division and the SRO duties. • There is also talk about moving the SROs back to patrol, but with the arrest rate and work the SROs are involved with now they may hold off. <p>(10:21) J. 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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ho'okala Program had 7 referrals from October 2021 to December 2021. 45 received attended care and 3 were cancelled by the police. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 4 males,; 3 were 15 years old, 1 is 16 years old and other, 17 years old. 2 Chuukese, 1 African American, 1 Hispanic, 1 Hawaiian <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 3 arrest made in Waikiki and the other in Kailua ➤ 2 youth charged with 2nd degree robbery, 1 for beyond parental control, 1 for 3rd degree assault and 1 runaway ➤ All 4 youth were successfully released to their legal guardians ➤ Follow-up made after 2 weeks and confirmed 3 of the youth have been stabilized and not re-offending • Police call to drop off a youth if they cannot locate their legal guardian within the 6-hour time limit. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ When they are brought here, they begin to resume locating their legal guardian <p>(10:) J. Paekukui Explained that with the reauthorization of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, a lot of new rules and procedures were enacted. Each State must have a Compliance Monitoring Manual which has to meet the statutory and regulatory laws. All States must redo their manuals with the deadline of July 13, 2022. He and Norene are working on the manual and is confident they can meet the deadline.</p> <p>(10:26) Paekukui explained that Jaque Kelley-Uyeoka volunteered to be the Secretary for the committee and will need to be voted in.
