MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY AND PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND FOR OTHER RELIEF

The Plaintiff, State of Hawai'i Department of Human Services (DHS), moves this court

for a preliminary and permanent injunction enjoining Defendants KALAMAPI'I PLAY

SCHOOL, MIE KANAMORI, and KIMBERLY PIERCE, and individuals acting in concert

with them from continuing to operate or maintain an unlicensed group child care center. An

injunction is necessary to: (1) prevent Defendants from continuing to provide illegal child care

by operating a group child care center without a license, (2) ensure the safety of the children in

Defendants' care, and (3) to enforce the child care licensing laws of the State of Hawai'i.

This motion is brought pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes §§ 603-21.9(1) & (6) and

603-23, and Rules 7, 65(a)(1) & (2) of the Hawai'i Rules of Civil Procedure. The motion is

supported by the attached memorandum, declarations, and exhibits herein.

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MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION; DECLARATION OF ERIN OKUDA; EXHIBITS 1-3; DECLARATION OF LISA GALINO; EXHIBITS 1-5; DECLARATION OF JANA PIIMAUNA; EXHIBITS 1–12.

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

Defendants, KALAMAPI'I PLAY SCHOOL (KPS), MIE KANAMORI (Kanamori), and KIMBERLY PIERCE (Pierce) (Collectively referred to as Defendants) applied for a license to operate a group child care center with the State of Hawai'i Department of Human Services' (DHS). Defendant Kanamori is the Director of KPS, and Defendant Pierce is the Owner of KPS. Declaration (Decl.) of Jana Piimauna. Rather than complete the application process and confirm that they could provide safe and appropriate child care in a licensed child care center, on August 22, 2022, Defendants opened and continue to operate an unlicensed group child care center in violation of §§ 346-151 and 346-161 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

II. PERTINENT BACKGROUND

DHS is responsible for enforcing the child care licensing laws pursuant to §§ 346-161 and 162, HRS, and chapter 17-892.1, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), (hereinafter referred

to Child Care Licensing Laws). The Child Care Licensing Laws statutes were enacted by the Legislature to protect infants and preschool age children who are in child care. The Child Care Licensing Laws ensure a minimum necessary level of safety and quality in child care facilities so that children do not get hurt and families and the community can be confident that their children will be safely cared for when not at home.

As explained above, Defendants applied for a license to operate a group child care center. Declarations (Decls.) of Erin Okuda and Jana Piimauna. In reviewing the application DHS through it Child Care Licensing Workers (CCLW), discovered that Defendants did not meet the Child Care Licensing Laws. Decls. of Erin Okuda, Jana Piimauna and Lisa Galino. There were two main issues with the Defendants' application. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Lisa Galino.

A. First Primary Issue: Unsafe Levels of Lead Inside and Outside of KPS

The primary issue with Defendants' application was that there were unsafe levels of lead inside KPS and in the soil outside of KPS, which is located at 55 Ululani St, Hilo, Hawai'i (Property). Decl. of Jana Piimauna. As part of the Defendants license application, CCLW required Defendants to have the Property tested for lead because the buildings on the Property were older and had decaying, chipping, flaking, and peeling paint throughout the inside and outside of the buildings. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 2.

Defendants received two separate lead testing reports, *Lead-Risk Assessment Report* dated August 17, 2022, and the *Lead-Wipe Clearance Report* dated August 19, 2022, both lead tests found the presence of unacceptably high levels of lead inside of the Property and outside in the soil of the Property. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 6, see map of lead on Property attached to Exhibit 6. Despite knowing that the Property was contaminated with high levels of lead,

Defendants, on August 22, 2022, opened KPS and started to provide care for young children at the Property. Decl. of Jana Piimauna. Defendants did not provide the two lead reports to CCLW until August 24, 2022, after they opened the child care facility. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda.

On August 23, 2022, Pierce emailed to CCLW the August 19, 2022, Lead-Wipe

Clearance Report. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 7. That day, Defendants were instructed by

CCLW to stop all child care. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda. On August 24, 2022,

Defendants knowing that there were high levels of lead inside and outside of the Property,

CCLW confirmed that Defendants continued to provide unlicensed care and again were directed
to stop all child care operations. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda. On August 24, 2022,

CCLW asked Pierce for a copy of the Lead-Risk Assessment Report because that report was
referred to in the Lead-Wipe Clearance Report. Decl. of Jana Piimauna. On August 24, 2022,

Pierce submitted to CCLW a copy of the August 17, 2022, Lead-Risk Assessment Report. Decl.
of Jana Piimauna, Exhibit 7. The Lead-Risk Assessment Report showed significant hazardous
levels of lead identified in the indoor areas of the Avocado and Sprout Houses as well as
"grossly contaminated lead-contaminated soils" on the exterior of the KPS property and the

Avocado and Sprout Houses. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 7, emphasis added.

On August 25, 2022, at the request of DHS, the Department of Health (DOH) Indoor & Radiological Health Branch, Thomas Lileikis, reviewed the August 19, 2022, *Lead-Wipe Clearance Report* and determined that, according to that report, all the dust hazards in the indoor areas were abated, however, information from the areas with deteriorated lead-based paint were not addressed and information about the exterior bare soil with lead hazards were also not addressed. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 8, emphasis added. Based on the two lead test

results, CCLW told Defendants that lead abatement and additional lead testing of all areas identified as contaminated with lead, inside and outside of the Property, must be conducted before Defendants could obtain a license to operate a group child care center. Decl. of Jana Piimauna.

On August 26, 2022, Pierce verbally informed CCLW that KPS would work to remove some of the soil from the areas that were identified to contain lead hazards. Decl. of Jana Piimauna. Pierce told CCLW that they would abate the lead and have the soil around the Property re-tested after the abatement and give CCLW the re-test results. On September 15, 2022, Defendants provided CCLW the *Lead Soil Screen Summary* re-test results which again indicated high levels of lead were present in the outside soil areas of the Property. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 9, emphasis added. Based on the September 15, 2022, lead re-test report recommendations, CCLW told Defendants that they needed to notify the DOH Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office of the *Lead Soil Screen Summary* of the re-test findings and to obtain guidance on necessary remedial action. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibit 9. Defendants have not provided to CCLW information confirming further remediation of the lead on the Property, confirmation that they are working with DOH on a remediation plan, or retesting of the areas with lead contamination inside and outside of the Property. Decl. of Jana Piimauna; Exhibits 10-12.

Throughout the Defendants' application process, CCLW repeatedly told Defendants they could not provide child care until all the lead test results came back clear and they submit confirming documentation to CCLW. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda. Upon receipt by CCLW of each of the three lead test results (two initial and one re-test), CCLW told Defendants that they could not care for children at KPS because of the dangerous levels of lead at the

Property that exceed DOH's acceptable level, that adequate lead abatement documentation must be provided to CCLW as specified by DOH, and that Defendants must stop all child care operations until the abatement is completed and re-testing results return clear. Decl. of Jana Piimauna. CCLW told Defendants that CCLW could not issue a license to a child care center with unsafe levels of lead, and for the safety of the children in Defendants' care, instructed Defendants to cease operations immediately. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda.

Part of CCLW efforts to work with Defendants included requesting necessary documentation to verify lead abatement and to verify that children are not allowed in areas contaminated by lead. Decl. of Jana Piimauna. Defendants have yet to provide the requested documentation. Decl. of Jana Piimauna. As a result, CCLW is unable to verify adequate lead abatement or that children do not have access to areas contaminated by lead. Decl. of Jana Piimauna.

B. Second Primary Issue: Staff Does Not Meet Required Qualifications

The second primary issue with Defendants' application was that none of Defendants' staff meet the required minimum staff qualification to run or teach at group child care center. Decls. of Erin Okuda and Lisa Galino. CCLW has requested and is waiting for Defendants to submit a comprehensive teacher waiver plan of action pursuant to § 17-892.1-17(i), HAR. Decl. of Lisa Galino. A teacher waiver plan of action requires Defendants to explain how their current staff plans to obtain the appropriate qualifications and includes information on how the waived teacher will be adequately supervised and guided to ensure that the waived teacher is able to provide developmentally appropriate activities in young children's physical, intellectual, emotional and social development and growth, along with adequate supervision according to the

ages of children. Decl. of Lisa Galino. CCLW is still waiting for Defendants written teacher waiver plan of action. Decl. of Lisa Galino.

C. Current Status of the Two Issues

Although the teacher qualification issue is concerning, DHS recognizes that it is not as pressing as the issue of lead exposure to the children. Nevertheless, both issues need to be adequately addressed by Defendants before they can be licensed to operate a group child care center. Decls. of Lisa Galino, Erin Okuda, and Jan Piimauna. Until both the lead abatement and the teacher qualification issues are resolved, and Defendants are granted a licensed to operate a group child care center, Defendants must cease all child care operations immediately. Decls. of Jana Piimauna, Lisa Galino, and Erin Okuda.

CCLW has worked extensively with Defendants to assist them in becoming licensed to operate a group child care center. Decls. of Erin Okuda, Jana Piimauna, and Lisa Galino. Defendants must work with CCLW and DOH, including providing to CCLW the requested documentation confirming successful lead abatement or alternatively, a plan showing restricted access to contaminated unsafe areas by children, and the staff waiver qualification action plan. Decls. of Jana Piimauna, Lisa Galino, Erin Okuda.

While CCLW was working with Defendants on resolving the issues identified above, on August 23, 2022, CCLW received a report that there was a post on Facebook showing a young child's first day at KPS on August 22, 2022. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda. Later that day, CCLW made an unannounced visit to KPS and observed 11 children and two staff in the house located on the Property known as the "Avocado House" and observed 14 children and three staff in another house on the Property known as the "Sprout House." Decls. of Jana Piimauna, Lisa Galino, Erin Okuda. In total,

CCLW found 25 children at the unlicensed group child care center. Decl. of Erin Okuda. CCLW met with Kanamori and Pierce who confirmed that they were operating a group child care center without a license and that they opened the KPS group child care center on August 22, 2022. Decls. of Jana Piimauna, Lisa Galino, Erin Okuda. CCLW told Defendants that they could not operate a child care facility without a license and instructed them to stop the child care operation immediately. Decls. of Jana Piimauna, Lisa Galino, Erin Okuda. Defendants refused and continued to operate. Decls. of Erin Okuda and Jana Piimauna.

The next day, on August 24, 2022, CCLW went to the Property and found that Defendants continued to operate without a license. Decl. of Erin Okuda. CCLW tried to enter the Property but there were newly placed padlocks on the gates, and CCLW could not get in. Decl. of Erin Okuda. Pierce approached the locked gates and refused CCLW request to enter. Decl. of Erin Okuda. Pierce told CCLW that gates were now padlocked for security reasons and because she did not want a repeat of the previous day. Decl. of Erin Okuda.

CCLW returned later that day and hand delivered to Pierce, who was in the parking lot outside the gates, a cease-and-desist letter which instructed Defendants to immediately stop operations. Decl. of Erin Okuda. CCLW told Pierce that there were two cease-and-desist letters, one for Kanamori, and one for Pierce. Decl. of Erin Okuda. CCLW explained that the purpose of the Child Care Licensing Laws are to ensure the safety of the children and reiterated the current unresolved issues in the Defendants' license application. Decl. of Erin Okuda.

Thereafter, CCLW made attempts to access the Property on August 25, 26, 29, 30, and 31, 2022 and on September 1, 2, 6, 7, and 8, 2022 to investigate the ongoing illegal operation but were refused entry by Defendants and the locked gates. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda. When CCLW went to the Property, Defendants provided CCLW, through the locked gates, with the number of children they had in their care for each respective day. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Erin Okuda.

To date, Defendants have not provided to CCLW the necessary documentation ensuring that the high levels of lead have been properly abated nor their written teacher waiver plan of action. Decls. of Jana Piimauna, Erin Okuda, and Lisa Galino. CCLW in consultation with DOH, has determined that this is "high risk" licensing enforcement case due to the lead contamination that still exists on the Property which poses an imminent health risk to the children in care. Decl. of Jana Piimauna.

III. <u>APPLICABLE LAW</u>

Applicable child care licensing sections of HRS:

- § 346-151 **Definitions**, provides in pertinent part: "Group child care center" means a facility, other than a private home, at which care is provided.
- § 346-152.3 (a) Investigations. Upon receiving a report that a person or child care facility may be caring for children in violation of this part, the department may conduct an investigation for the purpose of determining whether a violation of this part has occurred or is occurring.
- § 346-161 License for group child care home, group child care center required. No person shall operate, maintain, or conduct a group child care home or group child care center unless licensed to do so by the department of human services under this subpart.
- § 346-162 Rules: minimum standards. The department of human services, after consultation with the department of health, the department of education, and the fire chiefs of the respective counties, shall make, prescribe, and publish such rules as are deemed necessary to protect the best interests of minor children who are provided care in a group child

care home or group child care center and to carry out the purposes of this subpart.

§ 346-165 Visitation and inspection of group child care home, group child care center. The department of human services shall visit and inspect each group child care home and group child care center as frequently as it deems necessary for the proper operation, sanitation, and safety of the home or center, as the case may be. The visits and inspections shall be made at least once annually. Every group child care home and group child care center licensed under this subpart shall be open to visitation and inspection by representatives of the department of human services, the department of education, and the department of health, and by designated representatives of the respective county fire departments at all times.

Applicable child care licensing sections of HAR:

§ 17-892.1-3 (a) & (b) Inspection and issuance oflicense provides:

- (a) In exercising its authority to license child care centers or renew, suspend, or revoke license, the department shall analyze the qualifications of providers of child care, review the facility's written policies and program provisions, and inspect the child care facility. Authorized representatives of the department and parents or guardians of children in care may visit a child care facility at any time during the hours of operation for purposes of monitoring and inspecting the facilities, activities, staffing, and other aspects of the child care center. The department may' call on political subdivisions and governmental agencies for appropriate assistance within the agencies' authorized fields. (emphasis added).
- (b) The <u>applicant or licensee shall cooperate</u> with the department by providing access to its facilities, records, and staff. <u>Failure to comply with reasonable requests may constitute grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation of license</u>. (emphasis added).

Applicable court powers sections of HRS:

- § 603-21.9(1) & (6) Powers. The several circuit courts shall have power:
- (1) To make and issue all orders and writs necessary or appropriate in aid of their original or appellate jurisdiction;

. . .

(6) To make and award such judgments, decrees, orders, and mandates, issue such executions and other processes, and do such other acts and take such other steps as may be necessary to carry into full effect the

powers which are or shall be given to them by law or for the promotion of justice in matters pending before them.

§ 603-23 Injunction of violation of laws and ordinances. The circuit courts shall have power to enjoin or prohibit any violation of the laws of the State, or of the ordinances of the various counties, upon application of the attorney general, the director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the various county attorneys, corporation counsels, or prosecuting attorneys, even if a criminal penalty is provided for violation of the laws or ordinances. Nothing herein limits the powers elsewhere conferred on circuit courts.

IV. <u>ARGUMENT</u>

The Circuit Court has the authority in licensing actions to issue an injunction for continued violations of state laws pursuant to § 603-23, HRS. See also, *State v. Andrews*, 65 Haw. 289, 290, 651 P.2d 473, 474 (1982). An injunction is appropriate where: (1) the person seeking relief will likely prevail on the merits; (2) the public interest supports the granting of the motion; and (3) the person seeking relief is in substantial need of protection because the risk of irreparable harm to him if the injunction is denied outweighs the foreseeable harm to other persons. *Penn v. Transportation Lease, Hawai'i, Ltd.*, 2 Haw. App. 272, 276, 630 P.2d 646, 650 (1981), *Nuuanu Valley Association v. City & County of Honolulu*, 119 Haw. 90, 106, 194 P.3d 531, 547 (2008), *Life of the Land v. Ariyoshi*, 59 Haw. 156, 158-159, 577 P.2d 1116, 1118 (1978). See 7 Moore's Federal Practice, 65-39, ¶ 65.04[i] (1982).

An injunction is necessary and appropriate in this case due to Defendants' continued violation of state law. An injunction should be granted where: (1) the person seeking relief will likely prevail on the merits; (2) the public interest supports the granting of the motion; and (3) the person seeking relief is in substantial need of protection because the risk of irreparable harm to him if the injunction is denied outweighs the foreseeable harm to another person. Id. DHS has met each of the three prongs of this test, as set forth below.

In addition, the greater the irreparable harm that continues to occur without an injunction, the less the party seeking an injunction must show the likelihood of success on the merits. Likewise, the greater the probability that the party seeking an injunction is likely to prevail on the merits, the less the moving party must show that the balance of irreparable harm favors the issuance of an injunction. *Penn v. Transportation Lease, Hawai'i, Ltd.*, 2 Haw. App. at 276, 630 P.2d at 650.

A. Plaintiff Will Likely Prevail on the Merits

DHS's investigation shows that Defendants violated § 346-161, HRS, and § 17-892.1-3, HAR, by operating an illegal, unlicensed group child care center. Decls. of Erin Okuda, Lisa Galino, and Jana Piimauna. CCLW confirmed, through statements by Pierce and Kanamori, and by direct observations, that Defendants were aware of the Child Care Licensing Laws, knew that they had not met the licensing requirements and did not have a license when they opened the KPS child care facility, and continued to operate after DHS' demands to stop operation. Decls. of Erin Okuda and Jana Piimauna. Based on CCLW investigation, statements obtained, and numerous site visits, CCLW determined that the Defendants were operating a group child care center without being licensed by DHS in violation of § 346-161, HRS, and chapter § 17-892.1, HAR. Decls. of Erin Okuda, Lisa Galino, and Jana Piimauna. Defendants have been very clear that they know they are operating illegally and have defiantly continue to operate without a license. Decls. of Erin Okuda, Lisa Galino, and Jana Piimauna.

DHS has the exclusive authority to manage, administer, and enforce the Child Care Licensing Laws pursuant to chapter 346, HRS and § 17-892.1-3, HAR. Defendants are not licensed by DHS, as required by DHS's authorizing statutes, and cannot legally operate a group child care center. Because DHS can show that Defendants are operating

an unlicensed child care center, in violation of Child Care Licensing Laws, DHS is likely to prevail on the merits.

B. The Public Interest Supports Granting This Motion

The Child Care Licensing Laws were enacted to keep children from unsafe environments and protect them from being harmed by irresponsible caretakers running unsafe child care facilities. The public interest in Child Care Licensing Laws is reflected by the state Legislature's enactment of §§ 346-151, 346-161, and 346-162, HRS.

Section 346-161, HRS, prohibits a person from operating, maintaining, or conducting a group child care center without first obtaining a license from DHS. Defendants without obtaining a required license, opened and continue to operate a child care center, knowing the presence of unacceptable levels of lead on the Property poses a risk to children in their care and knowing that they do not have any qualified staff for the age group that they are providing care for. Decls. of Jana Piimauna and Lisa Galino. Moreover, Defendants' failure to cooperate with DHS' investigation by refusing CCLW entry to the Property and not by submitting the requested documentation violates § 17-892.1-3, HAR.

The public has a strong interest in protecting children from exposure to unsafe levels of lead and for families to know that the staff that is caring for their young children are qualified to provide that care. Moreover, the public interest in the safety of children in care is reflected by the enactment of the Child Care Licensing Laws and supports the granting of this motion.

C. DHS has Incurred "Per Se" Irreparable Injury

Violation of the child care registration laws is "per se" irreparable injury to DHS and the State. *State v. Andrews*, at 290, 651 P.2d 473, 474 (1982). In *Andrews*, the Hawai'i Supreme Court held that the continued violation of State law by the operation of an unlicensed private

school was "per se" irreparable injury to the State. Because continued violation of State law is a "per se" irreparable injury, the lower court's order dismissing a complaint for permanent injunction against an unlicensed private school based on the State's failure to establish irreparable injury or lack of an adequate remedy at law was erroneous. The Hawai'i Supreme Court held that there is no requirement that DHS establish that there is no adequate remedy at law. The court held:

At least, insofar as licensing requirements are concerned, it is clear that § 603-23, HRS, gives the circuit courts power to issue an injunction where there is a continuing violation of the laws of the State. The public policy of this State, as expressed by the legislature in the section of the statutes cited, requires that private schools be licensed. The continuing operation of such a school without a license is *per se* an irreparable injury to the public policy of the State.

There is no requirement that in enforcing the licensing laws of the State, by way of injunction, the State establish that there is no adequate remedy at law. The order appealed from, therefore, was erroneous and must be reversed.

Id. (emphasis added).

In *Andrews* the appellee failed to get a state required license to operate a private school. Similarly, in the instant case, the Defendants failed to get a state required license to operate a group child care center as required by § 346-161, HRS. The Defendant's violation of the state Child Care Licensing Laws is "per se" irreparable injury to the DHS.

Furthermore, the presence of levels of lead in and on the Property create an immediate risk to all the children at the Property. Defendants must work with DHS CCLW, including providing the requested documentation confirming adequate lead abatement or restricted access by children.

An injunction is necessary and appropriate in this case because DHS has meet each prong

of the three prong test because: (1) DHS will likely prevail on the merits; (2) there is strong

public interest in this motion as it concerns the safety of young children in care; and (3) there is a

substantial need to protect the children in Defendants care due to the risk of irreparable harm

from exposure to unacceptable levels of lead, and because the continued violation of the Child

Care Licensing Laws is "per-se" irreparable harm to DHS that outweighs the foreseeable harm to

Defendants of ceasing operations until they obtain the required license to care for young

children.

VI. **CONCLUSION**

For the foregoing reasons, Plaintiff respectfully requests that this motion for injunctive

relief be granted in addition to any other relief deemed appropriate by this Court.

DECLARATION OF ERIN OKUDA

I, ERIN OKUDA, hereby declare under penalty of law that the following is true and correct and based upon my personal knowledge:

- 1. I am currently and have been at all relevant time herein, an employee of the State of Hawai'i Department of Human Services (DHS).
- I have been employed by the DHS Child Care Licensing Central Hilo Unit
 (DHS CHU) as a Child Care Licensing Worker (CCLW) Human Service Professional for six years.
- 3. In that capacity and for six years, I performed child care licensing, registration, and investigations of illegal child care.
- 4. I am the DHS CHU CCLW assigned to the Kalamapi'i Play School (KPS) application to operate a group child care center at 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720.

- 5. I am the DHS CHU CCLW assigned to investigate the August 23, 2022, complaint against KPS, Mie Kanamori (Kanamori), and Kimberly Pierce (Pierce) (collectively referred to as Defendants) for conducting illegal child care.
- 6. I have personal knowledge of and I am competent to make this Declaration concerning the matters set forth herein.
- 7. As part of this investigation I conducted a thorough review of the DHS CHU records regarding the Defendants' child care licensing/registration and violation history.
- 8. The DHS CHU child care licensing records of the Defendants revealed the following:
- 8a. Defendants submitted to DHS CHU five separate applications for a license to operate a group child care center called KPS, located at 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720. The date of each application and the changes to the identification of the director of KPS as follows:
 - a. November 25, 2021, wherein Pierce identified herself as the director of KPS,
 - b. April 4, 2022, wherein Pierce identified the director as KPS as "TBD",
 - c. May 30, 2022, wherein a person by the name of Rachel Fernandez identified herself as the director of KPS,
 - July 6, 2022, wherein Pierce identified Raymona Souza as the director of KPS, and
 - e. August 1, 2022, wherein Kanamori identified herself as the director of KPS.
- 8b. A *Notice of Missing Applications Items* was sent to Pierce on three separate dates, January 13, 2022, May 11, 2022, and on August 2, 2022. The third notice included a list of items that were missing and required in order to complete the application. A true and correct copy of the DHS Notice of Missing Application Items are attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1.

- 9. From December 23, 2021, through August 24, 2022, I communicated with Pierce numerous times by phone, by email, and during site visits regarding Defendants' application for a license to operate a group child care license, and areas of deficiencies that need to come into compliance in order for Defendants to get a license.
- 10. On July 29, 2022, I emailed Pierce section 17-892.1-3.01 of the Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) pertaining to fines and penalties for operating a child care center without a license and requested that she read, review, and confirm that she received the email and that she understands the HAR. Pierce responded, "Yes. I am aware of this." I emailed the HAR to Pierce as Pierce's intended start date was approaching and I had concerns that Pierce would open the facility without a license. A true and correct copy of the July 29, 2022, email is attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit 2.
- 11. On August 23, 2022, the DHS CHU received a complaint against the Defendants for operating an illegal group child care center.
- 12. On August 23, 2022, I, along with CCLW Cheryl Uyeda (Uyeda) and CHU Supervisor Jana Piimauna conducted a visit to KPS to investigate the complaint.
- 13. On August 23, 2022, I observed 25 children present at KPS. Kanamori confirmed that KPS opened on August 22, 2022.
- 14. Defendants refused to cooperate with the CCLW investigation. I instructed Kanamori to call the parents to have the children picked up from the facility as the KPS was not licensed to operate by DHS. Kanamori told me to talk to Pierce. I reminded Kanamori that she is the Director for KPS and that she needs to contact the parents to have the children picked up. Kanamori refused to cooperate and again stated that I would need to speak to Pierce.

- 15. Kanamori and Pierce both confirmed that they opened KPS on August 22, 2022, and that the operating hours are from Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 4:30pm.
- 16. Pierce arrived and stated that she was the acting Director for KPS. I reminded Pierce that she does not meet the qualifications of a director, but Pierce continued to state that she was the acting director.
- 17. I asked Pierce to call the children's parents to have the children picked up from the facility. Pierce told us to "get comfortable because it's going to be a long wait." No calls were made while CCLW Uyeda and I were on site.
- 18. On August 24, 2022, I, along with CCLW Uyeda and CCLW Ian Tanioka (Tanioka) conducted an unannounced visit to KPS and were unable to enter the facility due to newly placed padlocks were put on the two gates to KPS. CCLW Uyeda and I asked Pierce for permission to enter the property to conduct a licensing investigation and that CCLW wants to see the sign-in sheets. Pierce responded that they are not required to have a sign-in sheet since the facility is not licensed. CCLW Uyeda explained to Pierce the importance of having a sign-in/out sheets, for example, how important it is to know how many children and which children are present at all times in case of an emergency.
- 19. Pierce stated that there were 11 children from the Avocado House and 16 children from the Sprout House. Pierce allowed CCLW Uyeda, Tanioka and I to access the front outside area and up the stairs to review sign-in sheets, but refused our access into the Avocado and Sprout Houses.
- 20. There were eight children signed in at the Avocado House. The Avocado House doors were closed and the curtains were drawn.

- 21. There was no sign-in sheet available for review outside of the Sprout House, so I visually did a head count of children I could see from outside. While I did the head count outside, Ms. Janet Bibilone (Bibilone) came out of the Sprout House and requested that CCLW Tanioka and I come into the Sprout House to count the children in care. I counted 19 children in the Sprout House.
 - 22. Pierce provided the sign-in sheet for the Sprout House, with 16 children signed in.
- 23. Later, on August 24, 2022, CCLW Tanioka and I went back to KPS to hand deliver a Notice of Violation and Cease and Desist letter (Notice) from DHS to the Defendants informing the Defendants that they were operating illegal child care and that they needed to stop the illegal child care operations immediately. Pierce was provided two copies of this Notice, one copy for herself and another copy for Kanamori. I offered to read the Notice to Pierce twice, but she declined and stated, "I know how to read." I informed Pierce to call or email me should she have any questions. Pierce gave a thumb's up in response. A true and correct copy of the August 24, 2022, Notice of Violation and Cease and Desist letter is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 3.
- 24. On September 26, 2022, CCLW Tanioka and I conducted an unannounced visit to KPS. Bibilone met us at one of the padlocked gates and stated that there were 20 children present in KPS that day.
- 25. On September 27, 2022, CCLW Tanioka and I conducted an unannounced visit and Bibilone met us at one of the padlocked gates and stated that there were 25 children present at the KPS that day.
- 26. Attached as Exhibits "1-3" are true and correct copies of those documents.

This is to inform you that the Department of Human Services (DHS) Central Hilo Unit (CHU) received information on August 23, 2022, that Kalamapi'i Play School was conducting child care without being licensed by DHS. Kalamapi'i Play School is located at 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720. As authorized by the Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) §346-152.3 Investigations, Child Care Licensing Worker, Erin Okuda, conducted an unannounced visit to Kalamapi'i Play School on August 23, 2022 for the purpose of determining whether you were operating without a license from DHS.

Ms. Okuda found that you and five (5) additional staff members were caring for twenty-six (26) children. During the unannounced visit, you confirmed that Kalamapi'i Play School has a full-day program from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and an extended program from 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., which runs Monday through Friday, and has started operations on August 22, 2022. Furthermore, DHS does not have any record of your facility holding a current child care license or having been authorized to operate a license-exempt child care program at this time.

Upon receipt of this letter, you are hereby mandated to immediately cease and desist all child care operations at Kalamapi'i Play School located at 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720, by the close of business on Wednesday, August 24, 2022. We are requesting that you also notify the parents or guardians of children enrolled in your child care program of the receipt of this cease and desist mandate.

Please be advised that in accordance with Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) §346-151 <u>Definitions</u> "Care" refers to those situations where a person or organization has agreed to assume and has been entrusted with the responsibility for the child's supervision, development, safety, and protection apart from the

parent or guardian and HRS §346-161 <u>License for group child care home, group child care center</u>, "no person shall operate, maintain, or conduct a group child care home or group child care center unless licensed to do so by the Department of Human Services."

Any violation of the child care law shall result in referral to the Office of the Attorney General for appropriate legal action. HRS §346-156 Penalty; remedies states that "any person, entity, agency, or organization violating any provision of this part or any rule made pursuant thereto shall be fined up to \$1,000 for each violation; provided that the fine may be up to \$3,000 for each day for a violation of section 346-161 or 346-171." Also, DHS may make unannounced monitoring visits to ensure your compliance with the child care law.

DECLARATION OF LISA GALINO

I, LISA GALINO, hereby declare under penalty of law that the following is true and correct and based upon my personal knowledge:

- 1. I am currently and have been at all relevant times herein, an employee of the State of Hawai'i Department of Human Services (DHS).
 - 2. I have worked at DHS for a total of 28 years.
- I have been employed by the DHS Child Care Regulation Program Office (DHS CCRPO) as a human service professional for five years.
- 4. In that capacity and for five years, I perform administrative rule making, policy clarifications for child care licensing and license-exempt programs and support quality in license and license-exempt programs.
- 5. I have personal knowledge of and I am competent to make this Declaration concerning the matters set forth herein.

- 6. Defendants Kimberly Pierce (Pierce), Mie Kanamori (Kanamori) (collectively referred to as Defendants) submitted to DHS CCRPO three (3) teacher waiver request forms dated August 16, 2022 for Janet Bibilone, Grace Francini and Mie Kanamori. A true and correct copy of the teacher qualification requests are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1.
- 7. My review of the teacher waiver applicants' qualifications included my consultation with People Attentive to Children (PATCH) Child Care Registry staff, Carol Wear and Leah McRae. Ms. Wear and Ms. McRae have expertise in analyzing and assessing individuals' early childhood education and experience qualifications and providing individuals with a career level framework and position qualification in a DHS licensed group child care center.
- 8. On August 29, 2022, I met with Pierce virtually through Zoom to discuss the additional information that is needed for the three (3) teacher waiver requests. Pierce and I also discussed the option of an additional waiver for staff member, Elise Kerr, who was qualified as an Assistant Teacher by PATCH Child Care Registry on May 31, 2022.
- 8a. During this meeting, it was communicated to Pierce that in order for DHS to consider approving her teacher waiver requests, Pierce had to provide a written plan of action for each teacher waiver applicant to inform DHS of who will be providing supervision, observation of the applicant with children, and meeting with the applicant to discuss curriculum and lesson plans that are developmentally appropriate to the ages of children in care on a regular basis.
- 8b. Since Pierce communicated that some of KPS staff members worked on a part-time basis, I told Pierce that the written plans of action shall identify the staff members' hours in order for DHS to assess the feasibility of approving all of the teacher waiver requests.

Pierce agreed to provide the requested written plans of action for Janet Bibilone, Grace Francini and Kanamori, and Elise Kerr's employment schedule.

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



Sorry for the delayed response. Thank you for submitting the additional documents. As mentioned in our meeting, the department currently has two different teacher waiver opportunities; one exists in the admin rules in the Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) §17-892.1-17(i), which waives a qualified individual to a position one step higher. Therefore, if approved, an assistant teacher would be waived into a teacher position or an aide waived into an assistant teacher position. The other waiver opportunity is our "super waiver" which would waive an aide into a teacher position as long as preschool teacher qualifications are completed within 2 years. The waiver period shall not exceed a 2-year period. Please note that each waiver has their own conditions that the teacher waiver applicant and the child care facility must meet before approval is granted.

DECLARATION OF JANA PIIMAUNA

- I, JANA PIIMAUNA, hereby declare under penalty of law that the following is true and correct and based upon my personal knowledge:
- 1. I am currently and have been at all relevant time herein, an employee of the State of Hawai'i Department of Human Services (DHS).
- 2. I have been employed by the DHS as a Human Services Professional for six (6) years.
- 3. I have been employed by the DHS Central Hilo Unit Child Care Licensing (DHS CHU) as a Supervisor for (3) three years.
- 4. In that capacity and for three years, I oversee child care licensing, registration and investigation of illegal child care.
- 5. I am the Supervisor for DHS CHU Child Care Licensing Workers (CCLW) Human Service Professionals and I provide oversight of the Kalamapi'i Play School (KPS) application for a license to operate a group child care center at 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720.

- 6. I am assisting the assigned CCLW, Erin Okuda, to investigate the August 23, 2022 complaint against KPS, Kimberly Pierce (Pierce) and Mie Kanamori (Kanamori) (collectively referred to as Defendants) for conducting illegal child care.
- 7. I have personal knowledge of and I am competent to make this Declaration concerning the matters set forth herein.
- 8. Defendants submitted to DHS CHU five separate applications for a license to operate a group child care center called KPS at 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720. The dates of the applications submitted are:
 - a. November 25, 2021, wherein Pierce identified herself as the director of KPS,
 - b. April 4, 2022, wherein Pierce identified the director as KPS as "TBD",
 - c. May 30, 2022, wherein a person by the name of Rachel Fernandez identified the director of KPS as Rachel Fernandez.
 - d. July 6, 2022, wherein Pierce identified Raymona Souza as the director of KPS,
 and
 - e. August 1, 2022, wherein Kanamori identified herself as the director of KPS.
- 9. On April 4, 2022, I assigned Defendants' applications to operate KPS to CCLW Erin Okuda (Okuda).
- 10. On or about May 16, 2022, during a telephone conversation, Pierce told me that she was the owner of KPS.
- 11. On May 16, 2022, Pierce sent me an email that had her identified as the Executive Director of KPS (A true and correct copy of this May 17, 2022, email is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1).
- 12. On July 21, 2022, as part of the application process, CCLW Okuda, and I conducted a site visit to KPS, wherein Pierce walked us through the KPS property. During the walk through,

CCLW Okuda and I observed numerous areas with cracking, chipping, flaking and peeling paint on both the inside and exterior walls of the "Avocado House" and the "Sprout House" which Pierce said would be the location where the children's classes would be held.

- 13. On July 28, 2022, and August 5, 2022, CCLW Okuda and CCLW Ian Tanioka (Tanioka) conducted site visits. CCLW Okuda and Tanioka observed numerous areas with cracking, chipping, flaking and peeling paint on both the inside and exterior walls the Avocado House and the Sprout House.
- 14. On July 28, 2022 and August 5, 2022, at the KPS site visit, CCLW Tanioka, took photos of the deteriorating paint located inside and outside of the Avocado House and the Sprout House. A true and correct copy of the photos are attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 2.
- 15. On July 26, 2022, because the KPS facility was built prior to 1978, I sent an email to Pierce requesting that Defendants complete a lead-based risk assessment conducted by an EPA-certified company and submit the test results to CCLW. A true and correct copy of the July 26, 2022, email is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 3.
- 16. On August 1, 2022, DHS CHU issued Pierce a letter which identifies substantial areas of non-compliance with Defendants' licensing requirements. A true and correct copy of the August 1, 2022, letter sent to Pierce, is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 4.
- 17. Between August 1, 2022, through August 17, 2022, CCLW Okuda and I worked with Pierce to provide Pierce with the necessary information regarding how the areas of non-compliance could be rectified so that KPS could obtain a license to operate a group child care center.
- 18. On August 18, 2022, the two (2) remaining deficiencies that Defendants had not resolved were to provide: (1) the lead-based paint risk assessment results and necessary lead

abatement testing results, and (2) evidence that KPS has the appropriate number of qualified preschool teacher staff to be licensed.

- 19. On August 23, 2022, DHS CHU received an anonymous complaint that Defendants had opened the child care facility and a picture of a child's first day at KPS was provided via social media, Facebook. A true and correct copy of the August 23, 2022, Facebook post is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 5.
- 20. On August 23, 2022, I accompanied CCLW Okuda and CCLW Cheryl Uyeda to KPS to investigate the alleged opening of KPS on August 22, 2022.
- 21. On August 23, 2022, I observed a total of 25 children at KPS with five staff members. I specifically observed, 11 children and two staff in the Avocado House and 14 children and three staff members in Sprout House. One child wandered out onto the lanai of Avocado House with no staff member and sat down and asked me to help her put on her shoes. This child appeared to be under the age of two years old and was wearing diapers. The child was not within sight or sound of a staff member. Thereafter, Pierce came from the Sprout House to the Avocado House to speak with us.
- 22. On August 23, 2022, at the site visit, CCLW Okuda and I told Pierce that she was operating illegally and that they did not have a license to open. We advised Pierce that she had not provided a Lead Based Paint Risk Assessment, nor did she have qualified staff to operate a child care facility. Pierce was also told that she needed to immediately close operations and contact the parents to pick up the children. Pierce stated that we should get comfortable because it was going to be a long wait.
- 23. On August 23, 2022, Defendants verbally confirmed that KPS opened on August 22, 2022, and provided child care services. The sign-in sheets indicated that eight children were signed in at the Avocado House and 14 children were signed in at the Sprout House.

- 24. On August 23, 2022, I received a copy of the *Lead-Wipe Clearance Report* dated August 19, 2022, from Pierce via email. A true and correct copy of the August 23, 2022, email from Pierce and the *Lead-Wipe Clearance Report* dated August 19, 2022, is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 6.
- 25. On August 24, 2022, I asked Pierce for a copy of the *Lead-Risk Assessment*Report since that report was referred to in the *Lead-Wipe Clearance Report*.
- 26. On August 24, 2022, I received a copy of the *Lead-Risk Assessment Report* dated August 17, 2022, which was prepared by Lehua Environmental Inc. A true and correct copy of the August 17, 2022, *Lead-Risk Assessment Report* is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 7.
- 27. The *Lead-Risk Assessment Report* showed significant hazardous levels of lead identified in the indoor areas of the Avocado and Sprout Houses as well as "grossly contaminated lead-contaminated soils" on the exterior of the KPS property and the Avocado and Sprout Houses. See Exhibit 7.
- 28. On August 25, 2022, the Department of Health (DOH) Indoor & Radiological Health Branch, Thomas Lileikis, reviewed the August 19, 2022, *Lead-Wipe Clearance Report* and determined that, according to the report, all the dust hazards in the indoor areas were abated, however, information from the areas with deteriorated lead-based paint were not addressed and information about the exterior bare soil with lead hazards were also not addressed. A true and correct copy of the August 25, 2022 email is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 8.
- 29. On or about August 26, 2022, Pierce verbally informed me that KPS will do work to remove some of the soil from the areas that were identified to contain lead hazards. Pierce

informed me that samples from the soil will be taken and would be re-tested and that she would provide me with a copy of the results.

- 30. DHS CHU CCLW conducted unannounced visits to KPS on August 25, 26, 29, 30, and 31, 2022 and on September 1, 2, 6, 7 and 8, 2022. The gates to KPS were padlocked and CCLW could not enter the KPS facility. CCLW were greeted by Pierce and KPS staff member Janet Bibilone on the specified dates from the other side of the locked gates, who verbally reported to CCLW the numbers of children and staff that were present at KPS on each date. Illegal child care was substantiated on each of the specified date.
- 31. On September 15, 2022, Pierce provided me with a copy of a *Lead Soil Screen Summary* dated September 15, 2022. A true and correct copy of the September 15, 2022 *Lead Soil Screen Summary* is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 9.
- 32. The *Lead Soil Screen Summary* provides that identified lead concentrations in the soil exceed the Hawaii Department of Health Environmental Action Level.
- 33. The *Lead Soil Screen Summary* report makes recommendations which includes notifying the DOH Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office of the findings and obtain guidance on remedial activities.
- 34. On September 19, 2022, the CCLW contacted the DOH and learned that Pierce had not contacted them. DOH confirmed that no contact was made by Pierce. A true and correct copy of the email is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 10.
- 35. On September 27, 2022, DOH confirmed again that Pierce had not made contact.

 A true and correct copy of the September 27, 2022 DOH email is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 11.

36. On October 5, 2022, I sent an email to Ms. Pierce at 8:35 a.m. to ask if she contacted DOH regarding soil remediation. To date, I have not received a response to this email from Pierce. A true and correct copy of the October 5, 2022, email is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 12.



2.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Lehua Environmental Inc. (LEI) has completed this lead wipe clearance testing after the dust abatement activities at the Kalamapii Play School located at 55 Ululani Street in Hilo, Hawaii (Subject Site). On August 18-19, 2022, LEI personnel performed site reconnaissance to conduct the lead wipe clearance testing after the completion of lead dust abatement activities, which included the wet wiping, HEPA vacuuming and wet wiping abatement technique for floor and window sills throughout the Subject Site.

The Subject Site includes two (2) single-story structures consisting of a kitchen, classrooms, restrooms and a covered wooden walkway.

Unitek Insulation (Abatement Contractor) was contracted to conduct the abatement of the previously identified lead dust within the Subject Site. LEI's August 17, 2022 lead risk assessment report, *Lead Risk Assessment Report, Kalamapii Play School, 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720*, 31 pages (Previous Report), identified lead hazards located throughout the Subject Site. The Abatement Contractor remediated only dust hazards associated with the Subject Site. Additional lead hazards may still exist as identified in the Previous Report.

Summary

In summary, the Abatement Contractor successfully abated the dust hazards identified on LEI's August 17, 2022 lead risk assessment report, *Lead Risk Assessment Report, Kalamapii Play School, 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720*, 31 pages. LEI's August 18 and 19, 2022 lead wipe clearance testing confirmed successful completion of the dust hazard remediation.

3.0 METHODOLOGY

LEI collected and analyzed twenty-seven (27) dust wipe samples after the completion of dust abatement activities completed by the Abatement Contractor. The purpose of the dust wipe clearance sampling was to confirm/deny the presence of lead dust at concentrations that exceed the EPA's dust-lead clearance levels after the completion of abatement activities. Lead dust clearance wipe results were compared to the following EPA dust-lead clearance levels: $\geq 10 \, \mu \text{g/ft}^2$ for floors and $\geq 100 \, \mu \text{g/ft}^2$ for window sills.

'Ghost Wipes TM' and pre-measured areas were used to wipe a proscribed floor and window sill surface area for each dust wipe sample. Pre-measured areas were taped off prior to wipe sample collection.

Each sample was placed into a sealable 50 ml tube, properly labeled and recorded following strict chain of custody procedures and submitted to Hawaii Analytical Laboratory, LLC in Honolulu, Hawaii for analysis via AAS in accordance with EPA Method 7420 for wipe samples. HAL is accredited for chemical analysis through successful participation in the EPA's National Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program (NELAP) and the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA).



Retest the existing soils after removal activities. If lead-contaminated soils will remain, develop a site specific DOH approved Environmental Hazard Management Plan.	

It is recommended that any activity that disturbs lead paint, lead contaminated soil, lead dust or any lead hazard corrective action be conducted by personnel with current Hawaii Department of Health Lead-Based Paint Abatement Worker/Supervisor certification.

Table 1 located in Appendix I summarizes the results of the lead wipe sampling. Table 2 located in Appendix I summarizes the results of the soil sampling. Finally, Table 3 located in Appendix I summarizes the results of the lead paint sampling.

The building layouts are identified in Maps 1 & 2 located in Appendix II. Soil decision units are identified in Figure 1 in Appendix II.

Laboratory results are included in Appendix III.

Summary and Recommendations

In summary, various lead paint hazards were identified at the Subject Site. Based on LEI's lead risk assessment, LEI recommends the following:

- Immediately incorporate ongoing lead paint maintenance activities into regular maintenance of the Subject Site, unless all LBP and LCP has been successfully abated (either it was removed, or it was enclosed or encapsulated without failure of those treatments).
- Eliminate all identified lead paint hazards identified in this report within 90 days of receiving this report. Corrective measures may involve permanent or temporary elimination of lead paint hazards.

Permanent corrective lead hazard control within the identified lead paint hazard locations includes the removal of poor condition lead-containing paint and lead-based paint, abatement of lead-containing paint and lead-based paint, enclosure, encapsulation, or replacement of building components coated with lead-containing paint and lead-based paint; and removal of lead-contaminated soil and/or overlaying of soil with an impermeable or semi-impermeable covering such as asphalt. (Grass and sod are considered interim control measures.) All of these strategies require worksite preparation; protection of building occupants and building occupants belongings; cleanup; waste disposal; clearance testing; recordkeeping; and, in some cases, monitoring. Certified or licensed abatement contractors must be used for permanent lead hazard control work, unless the intent of the work is maintenance, renovation, or rehabilitation.

Temporary corrective measures, using lead-safe work practices, include specialized cleaning, repairs, maintenance, temporary containment, paint stabilization and management and building occupant education programs. Paint stabilization is the process of repair of any underlying conditions, wet scraping, priming, and repainting surfaces; paint stabilization includes cleanup and clearance.

- If interim controls are used, conduct re-assessments at 2-year intervals to be performed by a DOH certified lead risk assessor, for lead paint hazards or failures of previous hazard control measures. Interim controls include dust removal; paint stabilization; treatment of friction and impact surfaces; specialized cleaning; installation of soil coverings, such as grass or sod; or land-use controls.
- It is recommended that any activity that disturbs lead paint, lead contaminated soil, lead dust or any lead hazard corrective action be conducted by personnel with current Hawaii Department of Health Lead-Based Paint Abatement Worker/Supervisor certification.
- The following recommendations should be followed in areas with soils identified to exceed the Hawaii DOH EAL for lead in soil. 1) contaminated soil removed from the Subject Site must be disposed of in accordance with Federal and State rules and

regulations, 2) dust control practices should include both wetting during soil disturbance activities and monitoring by a designated competent person, in addition to containing temporary soil stockpiles, 3) use of good general hygiene practices for tenants, public, employees and workers to avoid soil exposure, 4) long-term controls should be implemented on the site to minimize the potential for exposure to lead-contaminated soil by tenants, public, employees and workers, 5) possible need to cover any bare soil, if subject to wind or water transport off-site.

• Prepare and submit for approval to the Hawaii DOH Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) office a Construction Environmental Hazard Management Plan (C-EHMP) which outlines the proper handling and management of soil and/or groundwater, sampling and analysis protocol for soil, the planned re-use/disposal locations for excavated soil, health and safety measures to be taken to protect workers, environment and the general public. The C-EHMP should be approved by the Hawaii DOH HEER office prior to the start of lead-contaminated soil disturbance at the Subject Site.

3.0 INTRODUCTION/PURPOSE

A lead risk assessment was conducted on August 9, 2022 at the Subject Site. The lead risk assessment included the collection of lead dust wipe samples, surface soil samples, and lead paint samples from deteriorated condition paints at the Subject Site.

The lead risk assessment identified conditions considered lead paint hazards that could result in lead exposure to building occupants, maintenance staff and the general public. This lead risk assessment report can be used to develop a plan for eliminating any lead paint hazards that were identified, and may aid in establishing an ongoing lead paint maintenance and re-assessment program, if needed.

4.0 METHODOLOGY

This lead risk assessment is an onsite interior and exterior investigation to discover any lead hazards. Lead paint hazards may exist in paint, dust and/or soil at the Subject Site. LEI personnel conducted this lead risk assessment for dust, soil and paint in deteriorated condition at the Subject Site.

4.1 Lead Dust Sampling

LEI collected and analyzed twenty-two (22) dust wipe samples to identify those locations where a lead dust hazards may exist at the Subject Site.

'Ghost Wipes TM' and pre-measured areas were used to wipe a proscribed floor and window surface area for each dust wipe sample. Pre-measured areas were taped off prior to wipe sample collection.

Each sample was placed into a sealable 50 ml tube, properly labeled and recorded following strict chain of custody procedures and submitted to Hawaii Analytical Laboratory, LLC in Honolulu, Hawaii for analysis via AAS in accordance with EPA Method 7420 for wipe samples. HAL is accredited for chemical analysis through successful participation in the EPA's National Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program (NELAP) and the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA).

4.2 Lead Soil Sampling

The lead soil sampling at the Subject Site included a surface (0"-6" bgs) soils screen for lead. Laboratory analytical results of the soil samples were used to determine if the surface soils contain lead that exceed applicable DOH EAL at the Subject Site.

Multi-increment sampling (MIS) soil sampling was chosen for the Subject Site so that reproducible data, representative of average background concentrations, can be obtained for use as reference control data. A total of two (2) DUs were identified at the Subject Site. DU boundaries included the accessible bare soils of the building footprint and bare soils extending out 5' from the building perimeters. Each MIS soil sample consisted of 50 increments. Based on sampling theory (Pitard, 1993), a minimum of 30 increments per sample is generally recommended in order to obtain a reliable estimate of the mean concentration. The DOH typically specifies the use of 30 to 100 increments per sample in their Technical Guidance Manual (DOH, 2009b). Each increment was taken from 0-6 inches below ground surface for surface soils.

The location of each increment was based on a systematic random grid that was developed during the site visit. The grid was drawn with a random starting point for even distribution across the sampling area. The systematic random sampling design provided coverage of the DU along a horizontal plane, without the gaps associated with purely random designs.

Each increment was taken and then placed into a double-bagged Ziploc[®] bag. This process was repeated until 50 increments were collected. MIS soil samples were then placed into a cooler with ice packs for delivery to the laboratory for analysis.

Additional descriptions of the DU locations are listed below:

- DU-1: Avocado Building, bare soils extending 5' from the building perimeter inwards towards the building footprint and extending 5' outward from the building perimeter (primary sample), 0"-6" bgs
- DU-1B: Avocado Building, bare soils extending 5' from the building perimeter inwards towards the building footprint and extending 5' outward from the building perimeter (duplicate sample), 0"-6" bgs
- DU-1C: Avocado Building, bare soils extending 5' from the building perimeter inwards towards the building footprint and extending 5' outward from the building perimeter (triplicate sample), 0"-6" bgs
- DU-2: Sprout Building, bare soils extending 5' from the building perimeter inwards towards the building footprint and extending 5' outward from the building perimeter (primary sample), 0"-6" bgs

4.3 Lead Paint Sampling

LEI personnel collected and analyzed five (5) paint chip samples from deteriorated paints of the Subject Site in accordance with the EPA guidelines and recommendations.

The suspect lead-containing paints were wetted with amended water before sample collection. Paint was carefully scraped and placed into a labeled re-sealable plastic bag. The sampling equipment was cleaned between each sample collection to avoid cross-contamination between samples. All samples were properly logged and recorded following strict chain of custody procedure and submitted to Hawaii Analytical Laboratories, LLC for analysis in accordance with EPA method 7420.

5.0 CONTROL OPTIONS

Interim controls are defined as those measures which temporarily reduce or mitigate exposure to lead hazards. Interim controls include, but are not limited to: paint stabilization (covering with new paint); regular cleaning; regular maintenance; renovation; remodeling; temporary containment (i.e., covering lead paint with a new wall or floor surface); and covering lead containing soil with new sod or mulch.

Abatement is defined as the permanent (greater than 20 years) elimination of lead hazards. If abatement does not involve the complete removal of a lead hazard, the abatement method must be guaranteed by the manufacturer and/or contractor to last a minimum of twenty (20) years, or be designed with at least a twenty (20) year life span. Abatement methods include, but are not limited to: the complete removal of lead paint from substrates and components; the removal of lead paint covered materials; the permanent enclosure of lead hazards with construction materials; and the removal or permanent covering (with concrete or asphalt) of lead containing soil hazards.






Figure 1. Decision Unit (DU) Boundaries for Soil Screen of Bare Soils Kalamapii Play School 55 Ululani Street, Hilo, Hawaii 96720

Aloha all and thank you for your inquiry.

According to the reports, it appears that a Hawaii Certified LBP Risk Assessor provided some lead risk assessment activities for the subject property. The risk assessor found paint-lead, dust-lead and soil-lead hazards in various areas. Soon after, Unitek Insulation (a HI Certified Lead Abatement Firm) appeared to perform abatement of lead-contaminated dust only throughout the various areas (as stated in the clearance report, "Additional lead hazards may still exist as identified in the previous report").

Following the lead dust abatement, the risk assessor performed a dust wipe clearance. In the associated report, all the dust hazards were abated (the one failed sample subsequently passed after further cleaning).

Therefore, the lead-dust hazards have been abated. However, have the areas with deteriorated lead-based paint been repaired (to prevent the dust from re-accumulating)? Repainting is an option, although if any lead-based paint is disturbed during the re-painting activity, a painter with EPA RRP certification would be necessary (simply re-painting without existing paint disturbance can usually be performed by non-EPA certified contractors). Also, has the bare soil with lead hazards been covered or access restricted? This would be important if children have access to these areas.

Lehua Environmental Inc. (LEI) completed a lead soil screen (Screen) within the areas of surface soil removal and replacement with wood chips and wood mulch at the Kalamapii Play School located at 55 Ululani Street in Hilo, Hawaii (Subject Site). LEI's Screen included the multi-incremental sample collection of surface soils (0" - 6") below ground surface). The purpose of the Screen was to identify lead concentrations within the areas of previous soil removal and replacement with wood chips and wood mulch at the Subject Site.

Laboratory results indicated that the lead concentrations in the sampled locations exceed the Hawaii Department of Health Environmental Action Level (DOH EAL) for unrestricted land use and commercial industrial land use.

LEI recommends the following in areas with soils identified to exceed the Hawaii DOH EAL for lead in soil:

- 1) Contaminated soil removed from the Subject Site must be disposed of in accordance with Federal and State rules and regulations, 2) dust control practices should include both wetting during soil disturbance activities and monitoring by a designated competent person, in addition to containing temporary soil stockpiles, 3) use of good general hygiene practices for tenants, public, employees and workers to avoid soil exposure, 4) long-term controls should be implemented on the site to minimize the potential for exposure to lead-contaminated soil by tenants, public, employees and workers, 5) possible need to cover any bare soil, if subject to wind or water transport off-site, 6) notify the Hawaii Department of Health Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response office of these findings and obtain guidance on remedial activities, 7) limit exposure to the contaminated soils to properly trained personnel.
- Prepare and submit for approval to the Hawaii DOH Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) office a Construction Environmental Hazard Management Plan (C-EHMP) which outlines the proper handling and management of soil and/or groundwater,



sampling and analysis protocol for soil, the planned re-use/disposal locations for excavated soil, health and safety measures to be taken to protect workers, environment and the general public. The C-EHMP should be approved by the Hawaii DOH HEER office prior to the start of lead-contaminated soil disturbance at the Subject Site.

I am unsure if that is your department. I have attached what Kalamapi'i sent us. If you could point us in the right direction, we would appreciate it.

Aloha all and thank you for your inquiry.

According to the reports, it appears that a Hawaii Certified LBP Risk Assessor provided some lead risk assessment activities for the subject property. The risk assessor found paint-lead, dust-lead and soil-lead hazards in various areas. Soon after, Unitek Insulation (a HI Certified Lead Abatement Firm) appeared to perform abatement of lead-contaminated dust only throughout the various areas (as stated in the clearance report, "Additional lead hazards may still exist as identified in the previous report").

Following the lead dust abatement, the risk assessor performed a dust wipe clearance. In the associated report, all the dust hazards were abated (the one failed sample subsequently passed after further cleaning).

Therefore, the lead-dust hazards have been abated. However, have the areas with deteriorated lead-based paint been repaired (to prevent the dust from re-accumulating)? Repainting is an option, although if any lead-based paint is disturbed during the re-painting activity, a painter with EPA RRP certification would be necessary (simply re-painting without existing paint disturbance can usually be performed by non-EPA certified contractors). Also, has the bare soil with lead hazards been covered or access restricted? This would be

important if children have access to these areas.
