The Hawaii State Commission on Fatherhood was established by Act 156 of the 2003 Hawaii State Legislature.



The Legislature recognized the renewed national trend toward understanding the unique importance of fathers in the lives of their children, families and communities.



The Fatherhood Commission serves in an advisory capacity to State agencies. It makes recommendations on programs, services, contracts, policies, and laws relating to children and families. There are eight commissioners representing Oahu, Hawaii and Maui.



The Fatherhood Commission is administratively attached to the State of Hawaii Department of Human Services.

- Promotes, fosters, encourages, and financially supports programs designed to educate and train men who are both current and future fathers in effective parenting skills, behaviors, and attitudes, strategies for overcoming personal challenges, and opportunities to be productive responsible contributors to their families.
